How to study English law?

- Learning and teaching methods
 - Lectures
 - Provide an overview and guide you for further independent studies
 - Tutorials
 - Check and extend understanding
 - Consider problem and essay questions
 - Expectation of students' contribution
 - Seminars
 - Develop and test understanding
 - Presentation of papers and role play exercises



How to study English law?

- Assessment
 - Exams
 - Assessed coursework, including research based work
 - Dissertation
 - Group work
 - Presentations, including moots

N.B. Problem solving questions dominate in many subjects regardless of the format of the assessment. Enable examiners to test skills beyond mere re-call / rote learning and is closely related to legal practice.



How to study English law?

Key point!

- Studying law is not just about learning rules or acquiring knowledge. It's about learning how to use that knowledge, apply it, work with it and do things with it.



Entry requirements

LL.B Study Abroad:

- Academic : GPA 3 out of 4
- Language: IELTS 6.5 with no less 6.0 in each band



LL.M:

- Academic : LL.B degree or relevant legal experience and GPA 3 out of 4
- Language: IELTS 7.0 with no less 6.0 in each band
